Purpose of Parking Meters

- Create availability of onstreet parking
 - Goal of 1-2 available
 spaces per block face =
 15% available (85% occupied)
 - Benefits:
 - Good for business (easier for patrons to find a spot; more time to shop/dine)
 - Reduced traffic congestion (happier drivers; fewer accidents; reduced emissions)





- Parking meter rates must be **right** to help us get to the 85% occupancy goal
 - Occupancy higher than85% = rates should be higher
 - Occupancy lower than 75%= rates should be lower
 - Occupancy between 75%and 85% = just right






Goal

We want parking meter rates <u>low</u> enough to fill 75-85% of spaces, but <u>high enough</u> to make 1-2 spaces (about 15%) available on average.




- How do we get to parking meter rates that are "just right" (demand-based rates)?
 - Occupancy data collection
 - Slow and incremental rate adjustments, down or up, for blocks that need them until occupancy goal achieved
 - No more than 25¢/hour at a time
 - No more than once every 6 months





- Based on occupancy data collected in the CBD, we have initial rate adjustment recommendations
 - 23% of blocks need rate adjustment downward
 - 41% of blocks need rate adjustment upward
 - 36% of blocks need no rate adjustment





- Other elements of the plan:
 - Rates can be adjusted within a range of 25¢/hour to \$5.00/hour in CBD
 - It would take a minimum of 6 years for any block to reach \$5.00/hour, and only if supported by data
 - All rate adjustments to be reviewed and approved by PABC Board of Directors
 - Notice of rate adjustments to be provided to City Council Member at least 1 month prior





- Rates clearly visible
 - Rate stickers will be posted on signs when changes occur
 - Parkers can park on less expensive blocks if they would like
 - Parkers aren't surprised when they arrive at meters to pay
 - Rates also posted on meters& at
 - baltimoreparkingmeters.com
