The Department of Planning is in receipt of the parking plan for Residential Permit Parking Area #48 : Riverside. A thorough outreach and engagement strategy was followed which took into account the concerns of residents, businesses, nonprofits, the school, and the Department of Recreation and Parks.

Upon review of the proposal, we believe the appropriate analysis and communications have been performed by you and your staff. The Plan for Riverside is consistent with recommendations in the South Baltimore Gateway Parking Study finalized in September of 2017. The Department of Planning supports this plan as one component of a strategy to address the parking issues on the South Baltimore peninsula.
